Fantastic Beasts Write a report on your fantastic beast. Write in the style of the National Geographic for Kids fact files from Wednesday, e.g. Ten Facts About Great White Sharks: Write ten facts that include: -your creature's name -where you might find it -size Ë -diet -natural habitat -any special features it has, e.g. sharp teeth to catch its prey. Try and include some of the vocabulary that you explored on Wednesday and think about your Year 4 sentence types that you have learnt at school e.g. complex sentences, use of fronted adverbials, noun phrases. Remember to read back through your work and check your spelling and punctuation.
