The school's 'Attendance \& Punctuality Policy' states, 'No holidays in term time will be approved' and are therefore classed as unauthorised absences. Parents must complete an 'Application for Absence from School: Holiday / Extended Leave' in advance of any planned absence - copies available from the school office.

The minimum attendance target set by the government for all children across England is $96 \%$. Children with attendance below $90 \%$ are classed as persistent absentees. When attendance is a concern, we will monitor children's absences more closely, only authorise absences due to illness when sufficient medical evidence has been provided (GP appointment cards (enclosed) or prescriptions) and carry out home visits when children are absent. Failure to improve attendance / lateness can result in a referral being made to Lancashire County Council's Pupil Attendance Support Team (PAST), which could ultimately result in legal action being taken (including penalty notices).
