## Supervision before and after school

Parents are reminded that they are responsible for supervising their child and ensuring they behave appropriately before and after school. Children should only be arriving on the school grounds just before 8:20am, so that they are ready to enter the building when the bell rings at 8:20am.

Although we encourage children to use the play area safely after school, under the supervision of parents, this area is out of bounds before school. Children should not be using other school equipment, for example scooters and balls, before or after school.

Please can I also ask that you do not cut across the car park and stick to the footpaths provided. In assemblies, we have been reminding children about safety inside and outside of the school building and appreciate your support in reinforcing these measures. Many thanks for your support.

## **Medical Appointments**

I understand the difficulties parents can have in making medical appointments, but please book these outside of the school day so that your child's attendance doesn't suffer. If your child has had any historical attendance concerns, medical evidence will be required for the absence to be considered as authorised.

**Did you know?** If your child has an unavoidable appointment during the morning or afternoon, they can still get their attendance mark if they are in school for the registration session. In the morning, this is between 8:25am – 8:30am, and in the afternoon, between 12:45pm – 12:50pm for the infants and 1:00pm and 1:05pm for the juniors.

When the doors open at 8:20am, class teachers and teaching assistants are busy welcoming the children and supporting them with their learning. Please can parents go to the school office with any messages or information so that Mrs Attwood or Miss Turnbull can record the information on our school system and share with staff when they are not teaching.
